* focus on TIF project, and Sewer/Water sharing of resources; how to think more regionally

- * continue to enhance web presence; link data, best practices, resources ...
- * connect more with local businesses; health care; and education institutions;

* participate in 375th Celebration;

* open up websites; inventory; facilitate exchange of information;

* spearhead a Master Plan Eco. Devp. Chapter;

- * create repository for EEDC meetings, minutes, reports, data, etc.
- * Plan downtown beautification;
- * learn about Form based code; work with Planning Board and ZORC;

* engage industry and education leaders in workforce development;

* Suggestion made to repeat Visioning process, off-site, with facilitator; idea is to be discussed further at March 12th meeting; Can we do a vision session part 2 in Town Office? Or need to dedicate time and place off-site?
