

## **Exeter Human Services Funding Agencies**

### **Annie's Angels:**

Annie's Angels provides assistance to families struggling through life-threatening disease, illness, or disability. Priorities include household and medical expenses, travel and stays for medical services, services for cancer patients and companion animals for vets.

### **Big Brothers Big Sisters:**

One-to-one youth mentoring program matching area youth with adults.

### **CASA:**

Provides advocate services for abused/neglected children/youth in court so that they can thrive in safe and permanent housing.

### **Cross Roads House:**

Emergency shelter and supportive services for families and individuals experiencing homelessness.

### **Friends Program:**

Supports senior volunteers to support other seniors in the community with companionship, transportation and more and school-age enrichment programs.

### **Great Bay Kids:**

Provide quality early childhood care and education and after school programs.

### **Seacoast Eat Local**

Seacoast Eat Local cultivates a thriving local food economy by building bridges between regional food producers and consumers. One major program is providing SNAP (EBT/food stamp) incentive programs, enabling SNAP recipients to have better access to local food and expanding the amount of their SNAP benefits.

### **Seacoast Family Promise**

Seacoast Family Promise provides direct care for families experiencing homelessness with food, clothing, and other basic human needs. Through a community-based response, they empower families with children experiencing homelessness to achieve sustainable independence.

### **Seacoast Mental Health**

Seacoast Mental Health provides a broad, comprehensive array of high-quality, effective, and accessible mental health services to residents of the eastern half of Rockingham County. Services are provided to children, adolescents, adults, and families, regardless of the individual's ability to pay.

### **Saint Vincent de Paul**

Saint Vincent de Paul helps Exeter area people impacted by poverty by providing food and emergency financial assistance to those in need when other resources are exhausted. In addition to operating a food pantry, they provide urgent dental and medical care, emergency financial assistance, senior delivery services, homelessness assistance and Medicaid enrollment.

### **The Key Collective**

The Key Collective works to provide children without financial means the same opportunities that are available to peers. They offer a card program that allows enrollment to sports and youth activities at free or reduced pricing. In addition, there is a scholarship program for Exeter youth.

### **Waypoint (Richie McFarland Center included as of this year)**

Services provided by Waypoint include early support services, support for youth experiencing homelessness or at risk, and services for families with DCYF involvement or at-risk. Programs include a family-centered program for families living with children who have a chronic health condition, parent education and parent support, playgroups for children, a Drop-In Center for youth.

### **Womenade of Greater Squamscott**

Womenade provides emergency funding not readily available from other resources to families facing short-term financial setbacks. Funding is provided directly to the unpaid vendor or service provider. All funding goes directly to the community, as the all-volunteer Board does the work and pays for administrative costs.

### **Home Health VNA of NH (Seacoast VNA)**

Seacoast VNA provides home health care and hospice services with a mission of delivering innovative and responsive community health programs and providing effective and compassionate care. Patients receive skilled nursing care, rehabilitation and support services to all age groups at any stage of illness.

### **Rockingham Community Action (part of Southern NH Services)**

RCA supports low-income individuals and families with direct services, including fuel/electric assistance programs, crisis services, food pantries, homeless outreach/intervention and others. They work to prevent more families from falling into poverty and/or homelessness, and to assist at-risk families in finding long-term solutions to their economic needs.

### **Greater Seacoast Community Health/ Families First Health and Support**

Provides health services including dental

Provides support for victims of domestic and sexual assault and prevention education.

**New Generation**

Shelter for homeless pregnant women and mothers with babies and children

**One Sky Community Services**

Assist individuals and families with developmental disabilities or acquired brain disorders to help them live as contributing members in their communities.

**Rockingham Community Action/SNHS**

Works with low income households to enroll in fuel assistance, crisis services, food pantry, tax preparation and homeless outreach and loan fund.

**The Key Collective**

Provides \$200 scholarships for students who can't afford to pay for extracurricular activities with private businesses as well as a "Key Card" that gives students a discounted rate with organizations such as the YMCA and Exeter Parks and Recreation.
