

How Town of Exeter Support Impacts Services provided by HAVEN

For more than 35 years, A Safe Place provided services to Exeter residents impacted by domestic violence and Sexual Assault Support Services (SASS) assisted those impacted by sexual violence. On July 1, 2015, SASS and A Safe Place officially and legally merged into one organization, HAVEN, whose mission is to prevent sexual assault and domestic violence and to empower women, men, youth and families to heal from abuse and rebuild their lives.

One of the ways HAVEN accomplishes this mission is through its K-12 *Safe Kids Strong Teens* program that aims to prevent child sexual abuse, sexual harassment, bullying and teen dating violence. The goals of the *Safe Kids Strong Teens* program aim to influence attitudes and behavior and thereby reduce the likelihood of youth becoming victims of sexual or teen dating violence and to create a positive atmosphere for young women and men to build self-esteem and improve their lives.

This prevention program is further supported by a comprehensive client services program that includes:

- Emergency shelter
- 24-hour confidential crisis and support hotline 1-800-854-3552
- 24-hour accompaniment to police stations and hospital emergency rooms
- Accompaniment to courts and assistance obtaining restraining orders
- Safety planning
- Support and accompaniment for families at the Strafford County Child Advocacy Center
- Support groups for survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and parents.

With support from the town of Exeter, HAVEN was able to assist **73 Exeter residents** with 639.6 units of service in our client services program and through the *Safe Kids Strong Teens* program reached nearly **500 children, parents and teachers at Exeter schools** with critical information about safety and awareness.

Domestic violence, sexual abuse and teen dating violence are costly public health issues. Victims are more likely to suffer from low self-esteem, substance abuse and suicidal behavior. Adult victims often experience a loss of work and difficulty maintaining a job due to safety concerns and depression in the aftermath of abuse. Since we know that youth are the most at risk, the HAVEN *Safe Kids Strong Teens* school-based prevention program is critical to reaching out to current and potential victims. If HAVEN was not available to provide FREE services to the town of Exeter, the town would incur expenses related to the ongoing health and services required to meet the needs of those impacted by sexual violence.

Preventing domestic violence and sexual abuse and providing support for those impacted can lead to healthier and more secure children and adults. HAVEN has a strong history of producing positive results with programs and services as seen in the following excerpts from students participating in the *Safe Kids Strong Teens* Program and individuals and families accessing support in the 24-hour client services program.

“I feel so much better. My belly aches are all gone. No more secrets.” – Emily 8 year-old to HAVEN advocate while at the Child Advocacy Center

It is with great pride that we write this reflection on the first year of HAVEN. While we experienced a whirlwind of a year, we can report that indeed we have increased efficiencies and have begun the implementation of a strategic plan to increase capacity. We are enthusiastically doing even more to address our mission of preventing domestic and sexual violence and supporting and empowering women, men, youth and families in Southeastern NH to heal from abuse and rebuild their lives.

The first year as HAVEN has proven that our programs and services are in great demand. When reviewing statistical information, we have seen an overall increase in services provided. We do not believe that there has been an increase in violence, but we do believe that individuals impacted by sexual and domestic violence now know there is an agency to support their needs. This is a direct result of the work done during and after the merger process to raise awareness about HAVEN and the services provided.

Eliminating barriers for individuals seeking services and providing comprehensive responsive services to our community has been our goal with the merger and we are making great strides towards it. Additionally, our K-12 violence prevention education program, Safe Kids Strong Teens, continues to be a foundation for schools to build healthier communities. HAVEN is already fully booked for the 2016-2017 school year. This an area with tremendous growth potential, and we are continuing to explore ways to build capacity and innovate in order to reach every student in our catchment area..

In early 2016, the Board and management staff of HAVEN undertook the creation of its first strategic plan. Within the context of HAVEN's mission and vision, the Board and staff identified goals and strategies to create a framework in which to examine the current and future needs of its broad client base, to evaluate opportunities to leverage economies of scale, and to strengthen the organization's infrastructure to ensure a robust future.

We continue to receive great feedback from the community about the merger. We are encouraged by and grateful for the support of our donors, volunteers and community partners all doing great work to build a healthier place to live. 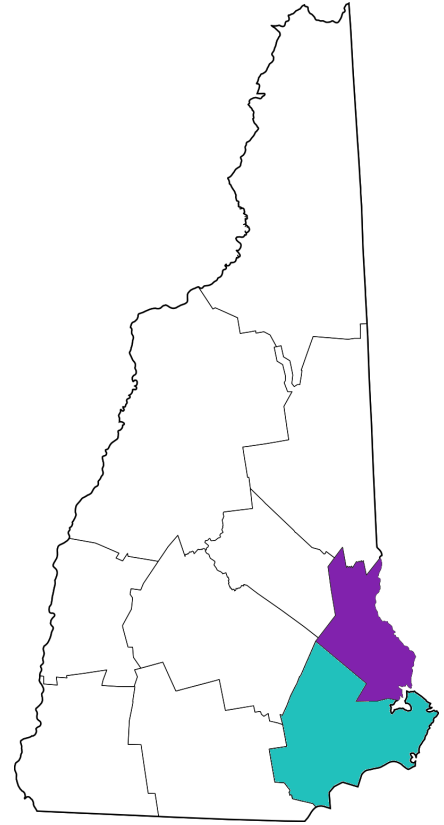

Client Services

HAVEN serves 48 cities and towns in Rockingham and Strafford Counties of Southeastern NH.

All of our support services for clients are free and confidential.

HAVEN provides support services to victims, survivors and anyone impacted by domestic and sexual violence and stalking regardless of gender, age, health status, physical, mental, or emotional ability, sexual orientation, gender identity/expression, socioeconomic status, race, nationality, immigration status, religious and political affiliation.



Services available are:

- **24 –hour confidential hotline staffed by trained advocates 1-603-994-SAFE (7233)**
- **24-hour accompaniment services for victims to hospital emergency rooms**
- **Advocate accompaniments to Child Advocacy Centers and courts**
- **Referrals and information on safety planning, therapists and emergency, temporary and permanent restraining orders.**
- **Safe shelter for women and their children escaping violent living situations**
- **Support groups for survivors and those impacted by domestic and sexual violence**
- **Access to innovative therapeutic programs like Trauma Sensitive Yoga in partnership with Seacoast Area Teachers of Yoga (SATYA)**
- **911 cell phones**
- **Emergency assistance with food and supplies for women and children**

The Safe Kids Strong Teens prevention education program of HAVEN is presented in K-12 classrooms throughout Southeastern New Hampshire. Our team of educators present age appropriate, interactive curricula on:

Personal Body Safety Puppet Shows: Grades K-4

Internet/Technology Safety: Grade 5

Sexual Harassment and Bullying: Grade 6

Media Matters: Grade 7

C.A.R.E. (Consent, Awareness, Respect and Empathy) Series: Gr. 8 & up

K.E.Y. Workshop – Knowledge Empowers You: High School

This past year educators also incorporated relationship violence programming into the C.A.R.E. series and presented a film made with local students, *Take Me as I Am*.

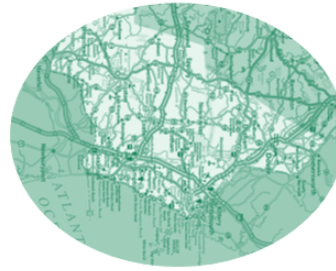
Organizational Infrastructure

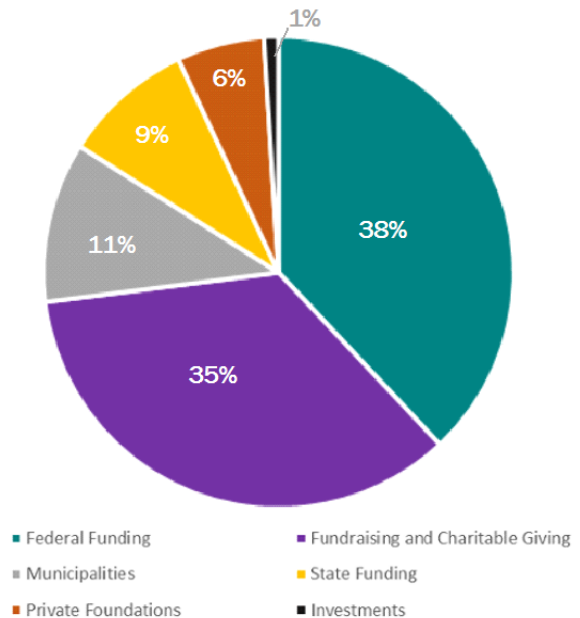
