

On behalf of our clients, our Exeter neighbors in need we would like to express gratitude for the funding that was provided in 2022. This generosity contributed to assisting us provide nutritious foods, household supplies, emergency financial funds and senior delivery services. **Exeter residents account for 93% of our client base.** We are therefore, requesting \$10,000.00 in funding to continue to help our clients.

Our mission at our Food Pantry and Cleo Castonguay Community Assistance Center is to help Exeter area people impacted by poverty to achieve and maintain self-sufficiency. Through person-to-person contact, we are committed to respecting the dignity of those we assist, offering compassion and care, embracing the diversity, and serving people of all backgrounds and beliefs. Those we assist are also helped to achieve self-sufficiency in the long term and the sense of self-worth it provides.

Our Food Pantry and Community Assistance Center is supported primarily through donations, with one full time staff member and five-part time employees. We currently are fortunate to have 76 volunteers. SVdP Exeter was the first food pantry in NH to be awarded the NH Food Bank Gold Certified Nutritional Pantry. We work hard to improve the lives of the people we serve.

In addition to our Food Pantry, our Community Assistance Center serves Exeter area neighbors that are struggling in poverty with emergency financial support and help for homeless persons. In collaboration with Families First, we are providing medical health services.

Society of St. Vincent de Paul Exeter Food Pantry and Cleo Castonguay Community Assistance Center Programs

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul Exeter (SVdP) was established in 1989, this is our 34th year with the mission to provide food and emergency financial assistance to those in need when other resources have been exhausted.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul Exeter offers food and emergency financial assistance to low-income residents of Exeter, Stratham, Newfields, Brentwood, Kensington, and East Kingston.

SVdP Exeter provides the community not only with food but with many other critical services such as medical care, emergency financial assistance, senior delivery services, homeless assistance and Medicaid enrollment. These low income resources are offered to low income households, without any residential requirements.

Food Pantry

SVdP Exeter encourages our food clients that are low-income individuals and families to visit us weekly. We are designed to be a supplemental group to help support the households we serve. Clients can frequent our Food Pantry as often as once a week. We provide nutritious and essential foods such as; milk, butter, eggs, fresh produce, bread, meats, non-perishable foods and personal hygiene items. In 2022, we had approximately 2,630 client visits. In 2022, we had 196 new food pantry clients. We highly encourage our client base to visit our pantry regularly. The money our clients save by coming to the pantry can be used towards their expenses like rent, utilities and car repairs. Our clients are faced with unstable inventories and soaring food prices at grocery stores this year. Thanks to SVdP Exeter, our clients can rely on receiving critical nutritional items and personal care items.

Senior Home Delivery

We provide monthly food delivery service for housebound low-income senior clients that are residents of 277 Water Street, Exeter NH and Meeting Place, Exeter NH. We furnish our senior delivery clients with foods and personal care items to meet senior's unique needs. In 2022, we made 272 deliveries to our low-income seniors in Exeter. Many of our most vulnerable clients are struggling with a number of issues including strained support systems. SVdP Exeter is there to ensure they are supplied with specialty items such as incontinence products, easily accessible foods and low sodium items.

Starting in 2020, SVdP Exeter partnered with Meals on Wheels Exeter to offer delivery services to any of our senior clients that reside in Exeter or Stratham. Therefore, all our senior clients have access to our food pantry if it is delivered or picked up on their behalf.

Milk, Butter, Eggs, Orange Juice, and Fresh Produce Program

We are committed to providing critical nutritional fundamentals to all of our clients by offering low-fat milk, butter instead of margarine, fresh eggs, orange juice and fresh local produce to our clients. We are making gallant efforts to distribute healthier foods to our clients that we serve. We want to ensure we

are offering fresh produce in addition to non-perishable items. We are campaigning to educate our donors and supporters to create awareness to provide nutrition not just food for our neighbors in need.

Summer Family Food Program

The Summer Family Food Program is designed to provide extra food to families with school-aged children during vacations. If your family has two students that receive free breakfasts and lunches each week, those are 20 additional meals you are struggling to get on the table in the summer months. Families may have access to the Food Pantry weekly rather than monthly so that no child goes hungry when school is out. Hunger does not take a vacation.

Emergency Financial Assistance

Residents of Exeter, Stratham, Newfields, Brentwood, Kensington, and East Kingston can apply for possible emergency financial assistance once exhausting all other available resources and obtaining a 'Letter of Decision' from their town Welfare Director. Examples of financial emergencies include an eviction notice, a utility shut-off notice or car repair. SVdP Exeter works closely with local town Welfare Directors. We are able to prevent evictions, keep lights on for families and keep transportation running to get to work. We are able to help when all other resources have been exhausted.

Healthcare

Medical services are offered in our van that is staffed through Families First. Services are offered to adults who are homeless, without stable housing, or low income. A doctor, nurse, and social worker are available to see patients with no appointment needed. Transportation is a major issue for those struggling in poverty, being able to offer medical services here in Exeter to homeless or near homeless patients is critical. Exeter is the busiest of the satellite medical sites that Families First offers. For many seeking medical treatment, this is their only access to medical care.

Homeless Assistance

For those who are unsheltered, SVdP Exeter can provide survival food, blankets, clothing, transportation and accommodations when needed. We are able to refer resources such as housing authorities to help secure shelter. Regardless of how people arrive at our door, they are greeted with dignity and provided with essentials.

Medicaid Enrollment

A representative from Families First is at SVdP on Wednesdays to assist with Medicaid enrollment. Families First is here to help New Hampshire residents learn about options for affordable health insurance through the New Hampshire Marketplace and Medicaid. Our enrollment counselor works with individuals to figure out which health insurance coverage they may be eligible for.

- 8 auto repairs were paid for to ensure transportation.
- 17 homeless clients were provided emergency food, supplies and accommodations.

With significant impact in 2022 of from the pandemic. Many of the organizations we collaborated with changed to working remotely during COVID-19 pandemic. However, the Food Pantry stayed open, providing the public with access through curbside delivery and expanded food pantry hours. During the pandemic, we also allowed clients to visit the pantry weekly, instead of monthly. To ensure the most vulnerable community members have access to food, we expanded our senior delivery program and partnered with Meals on Wheels to guarantee everyone who needed it had access to food.

We are proud to report we have remained open for each food pantry session. When you are providing a fundamental need such as food, we are acutely aware of how critical it is. Without SVdP Exeter, many families would be struggling to put food for their tables. Thanks to us they have come to depend on our constancy of offering healthy foods and necessary personal care items.

SVdP Exeter is also a resource that is available when all other doors have been shut. Who did the single mother turn to for a gas card when she had to bring her infant to Boston to a specialist? Who did the senior gentleman contact when he was given a shut off notice for his power? Who did the parents call to request assistance when the family car failed annual inspection? SVdP Exeter.

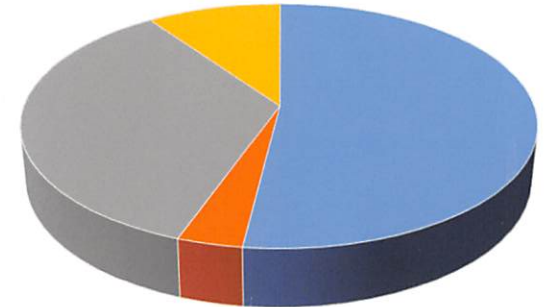


Senior Delivery
