CACR9 **Title:** relative to municipal taxes. Providing that municipalities may not raise property taxes greater than 2 percent per year and no greater than 1 percent per year on disabled citizens or senior citizens. This 2% of tax billed, not tax rate.

HB 67 **Title:** relative to warrant articles in official ballot town, school district, or village district meetings.

 If an article is amended at deliberative then both original and amended version will be placed on the ballot. If there is a tie the vote then the original article will be deemed approved.

HB 111 **Title:** relative to establishing a cause of action against the state to protect individual rights.

 Provides that agents (elected officials, employees and volunteers) of the government (State, local, school) may be named in lawsuits against TOWN.

HB 167 **Title:** relative to net energy metering limits for customer generators and the purchase of output of limited electrical energy producers.

• maximum rated capacity of (a) up to and including 3 megawatts upon the effective date of this paragraph, and (b) less than 5 megawatts on and after January 1, 2022

HB 266 **Title:** relative to enforcement of immigration laws and the prohibition of sanctuary policies.

- Prohibits any municipal governing body from adopting or enforcing a policy to prohibit or in any way restrict or discourage the enforcement of federal immigration law.
- Requires police departments to act as Immigration and Customs Enforcement agents.
- Training to be paid by municipalities.

HB 341 Title: relative to permissible residential units in a residential zone.

 Allows as a matter of right for any single-family dwelling in a residential zone served by water and sewer to be configured as up to 4 units in various configurations. It applies to new construction or rehabilitation of existing buildings.

HB 544 **Title:** relative to the propogation of divisive concepts.

• This bill defines and prohibits the dissemination of certain divisive concepts related to sex and race in state contracts, grants, and training programs.

HB 588 Title: relative to building codes for tiny houses.

- Defines "tiny houses" and conditions for lot placement.
- Requires water and sewer connection.
- Enabling action. A municipality may adopt this provision by ballot

SB 130 Title: relative to education freedom accounts.

• Provides \$5,000 grants to students attending schools other than public schools.
