- Discussion the additional task to educate the public on the status of the Sustainability Coordinator position. As residents of Exeter voted in favor of the creation of an office and that Budget Recommendations Committee voted to not fund the position and the committee would like to inform the public. Potentially through coffee discussions/smaller group meetings at Ollie and Me.
- Ms. Corson informed that no one on the Committee, as a representative of the Town, may advocate for or campaign for or against something - but only educate. And that all communications from the Board on social media must go through a town employee.
- Ms. Tyner stated that we are in a better position than last year when the film festival was held.
- As whole the committee decided to push the Sustainability Fair until later in the year to ensure it could receive proper attention.
- A task for all committee members is to brainstorm ways in which the public can be educated about about the Budget Recommendations Committee Decision and what options there are moving forward. (Potentially educate on other BRC
