Notice from the NH Port Authority regarding Tidal Coastal Mooring Permits

Applications for tidal coastal mooring permits are due no later than March 1st. Please plan to review your boat registration(s) early to ensure meeting the March 1st deadline. Remember to allow sufficient time for mail-in-boat renewals, as these transactions generally take longer. Early tidal mooring permit reapplications are accepted. Please call 603-436-8500 for more information on tidal mooring permit renewals.

Please note that inland mooring renewals and applications continue to be processed by NH Marine Patrol.

Commercial Boat Inspections

All new and renewal commercial boat registration applications must be processed at the Concord DMV office. All new applications must be processed in person; renewals can be processed in person or by mail. Once your renewal application has been submitted, please contact Marine Patrol at 603-293-2037 ext. 2 or by email at mpfrontoffice@dos.nh.gov to schedule your commercial inspection!

Commercial inspections can be completed as soon as Marine Patrol receives your 2025 boat registration. Marine Patrol officers are available off-season; for your convenience, your vessel(s) can be inspected while in storage (provided all safety equipment is available and in good working condition). Don't delay, call today!

Wake Responsibility

NH Marine Patrol would like to remind the operators of wake/ballast boats that they are responsible for their wake. Marine Patrol along with the NH Marine Trades and Water Sports Industry Associations (WSIA) encourage wake surfers to:

- Stay at least 200 feet from shore, docks, and other structures.
- Keep music at reasonable levels. Keep the volume low and remember no offensive lyrics.
- Minimize repetitive passes along residential shorelines.

Life Jackets Required for Stand-Up Paddleboards (SUP) & Wake Boarders

Stand up paddleboards are considered boats by the United States Coast Guard and the State of New Hampshire. Accordingly, all persons using a SUP are required to carry a wearable life jacket on board while paddling. The Marine Patrol also reminds boaters and paddlers that anyone 12 years of age and under must be wearing their life jacket at all times while aboard any type of boat/SUP.
