 - i) Exhibit A decision from the probate court from 1997 trust originally wanted to keep the money spent for boys separate from the money sent for girls; Trustees requested to modify this so that the financial support given was for both males and females; Court agreed and changed the charge. "In keeping with the court decree of June 1996 the Robinson Trust will award grants which enrich and enhance the educational experience of post-elementary individuals served by the ERSCD."
 - ii) We no longer work with the Greater Piscataqua Community Foundation Should we look at offering more availability to mini-grants, rather than the large scale.
